## Proclamation on Advancing the Safe Resumption of Global Travel during the COVID-19 Pandemic

**Updated 12/6/2021** 

Effective November 8, 2021, President Biden has issued <u>Proclamation on Advancing the Safe</u> <u>Resumption of Global Travel during the COVID-19 Pandemic</u>. The proclamation includes the following:

- The proclamation revokes the <u>regional travel bans</u> on travel from Brazil, China, India, Iran, Ireland, the Schengen Area, South Africa and the United Kingdom.
- Nonimmigrant foreign nationals, including F and J students and scholars, must provide proof of **COVID-19 vaccination** and will need to get a **COVID-19 viral test** (regardless of vaccination status or citizenship) no more than 1 day before you travel by air into the United States. You must show your negative result to the airline before you board your flight.
- Exceptions to the vaccination requirement apply to anyone under age 18 or to travelers from countries with **limited access to COVID-19 vaccines**.
