

Proclamation on Advancing the Safe Resumption of Global Travel during the COVID-19 Pandemic

Updated 12/6/2021

Effective November 8, 2021, President Biden has issued [**Proclamation on Advancing the Safe Resumption of Global Travel during the COVID-19 Pandemic**](#). The proclamation includes the following:

- The proclamation revokes the [**regional travel bans**](#) on travel from Brazil, China, India, Iran, Ireland, the Schengen Area, South Africa and the United Kingdom.
- Nonimmigrant foreign nationals, including F and J students and scholars, must provide proof of [**COVID-19 vaccination**](#) and will need to get a [**COVID-19 viral test**](#) (regardless of vaccination status or citizenship) no more than 1 day before you travel by air into the United States. You must show your negative result to the airline before you board your flight.
- Exceptions to the vaccination requirement apply to anyone under age 18 or to travelers from countries with [**limited access to COVID-19 vaccines**](#).
