Netid & Password

To create your NetID & Password, look for the email from the Office of International Admissions titled:

"Your Name, Congratulations - You Are Admitted!"

1. Create your Net ID and Password:

Your NetID is like your username for logging into the University of Arizona systems and will also be your email name - so choose your NetID wisely. Use your Student ID and PIN below to create your NetID at http://netid.arizona.edu.

Student ID:

Take note of your U of A Student ID Number, NetID & Password because you will need them throughout your career as a U of A student!



Netid & Password

You will use your NetID & password to access all U of A resources:

- U of A email (Catmail)
- Online Learning Platform D2L
- Student Portal: UAccess
- U of A Library

Please set this up as soon as you receive your acceptance email from the U of A!



Netid+ & Duo Mobile

NetID+ is the second layer of authorization and security to protect your U of A account.

When you login the first time after creating your NetID, you will be prompted to sign up for NetID+.


Please download the Duo Mobile app to your phone first, set up your account there, and then proceed to set up NetID+ with the U of A.

2. Create your NetID+ account

Once you have created your NetID, please follow the instructions for creating your NetID+ account (https://netid-plus.arizona.edu) and download the DuoMobile app to your phone (available for Android and Apple iOS).



NetID+ is required for the requested service.

3. Log in to your Arizona CatMail:

Now that you have been admitted, the University of Arizona will send all communications to your CatMail account (<u>outlook.arizona.edu</u>). Your official email "CatMail" is created automatically when you created your NetID. You should check your CatMail on a daily basis or forward it to an account that you use more regularly. Please Note: CatMail is powered by Outlook.

Your Catmail account may take 24-48 hours to activate after your NetID is created. Contact UITS for issues.

Email Forwarding

If you are concerned about monitoring multiple email accounts (U of A, home school, personal), we recommend setting up email forwarding.

You must use a web browser to setup email forwarding. You can turn forwarding on or off at any time.

You can also change the email address you forwarded to as often as you like. However, the messages you received before you set up the forwarding will not be re-delivered to the address you add.


5. Log in to Desire to Learn (D2L):

Course Enrollment

AZI will enroll you into your courses. Please do not self-enroll!

If you need to...

- Withdraw from 1 U of A course due to possible failure
- Take a leave of absence and withdraw from all U of A courses
- Permanently leave the dual degree program and withdraw from all U of A courses

Please contact your U of A Location Manager or Representative immediately.

Student Success Courses: HED 102A & HED 102B

- **Credits:** .5 each (1 credit total)
- Duration: 7.5 weeks each
- Modality: Asynchronous online (no live meetings)
- Terms: Fall typically part A and Spring typically part B
- Instructor: Miss Katelyn Maragi
- **Due Dates**: Assignments due each week on Sundays
- Classmates: Multiple Microcampus locations will take the course together
- Grading: Pass or Fail (grade will appear on U of A transcript)
- Topics: U of A history, Higher Education in the U.S., academic integrity, time management skills, cross-cultural collaboration skills, etc.

Degree Seeking Transition

- If you are beginning your microcampus career as non-degree seeking at U of A, you will need to become degree seeking at U of A in the future, either before Year 3 or during Year 3
- You will need to submit another application to U of A
- Detailed instructions and requirements will be sent to you in the future

Degree Seeking Requirements

- Submit U of A degree seeking application
- Submit official transcripts from all current or prior universities in English
- Satisfy GPA requirements (vary by U of A major)
- Satisfy Proof of English Proficiency

English Proficiency Options

- Options vary by program
- Confirm with your U of A Location Manager or Representative which options are available to you
 - Option A: complete equivalent courses of ENGL 107 and ENGL 108 with an equivalent grade of C or higher in BOTH classes
 - Option B: pass English exam (IELTS, TOEFL, etc.)

Minimum Exam Scores

Transfer Credit Requirements

- You will need to transfer coursework into U of A from your home institution to earn your U of A degree.
- You must earn an equivalent of a C grade or higher in each course for it to transfer in.
- View your student handbook to confirm what a C grade equivalent is at your school.

Graduation Timeline

- After you have completed all requirements, you will earn your U of A degree!
- You're invited to attend graduation events in Tucson!
- Your U of A diploma will be shipped to your home university a few months after your final semester of study
- Detailed graduation requirements and important information will be sent to you in the future



Grading

- GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)
- Your GPA includes U of A grades only.
- Find your GPA in UAccess Student Center

• Letter Grades / Grade Points

• WHAT IS A GOOD GPA?

- Your GPA needs to be at least 2.0 for you to successfully progress in your degree.
- Grades A, B, C will earn you a good GPA.
- Grade D is still a passing grade, but it will bring your GPA down.
- Grade E is a failing grade, and you will need to repeat the class, which may delay your graduation.



U of A Degree Requirements

- · Complete all required courses, including your home university courses that count towards the U of A degree.
- **D** grades in U of A courses are technically passing but may need to be retaken depending on your specific program policies.
- **D** grades in U of A courses may not be a passing grade at your home university and may need to be retaken. Check with your local university advisor.
- Pass your classes at your local university with a **C** or better for them to count towards your U of A degree.
- Must achieve minimum 2.0 overall GPA and major GPA to earn undergraduate degree.
- Admission to most master's programs requires a minimum
 3.0 GPA.



Maintaining a 2.0 GPA

- "C" Average
- Maintaining a 2.0 GPA means you should be earning C's or higher in your U of A classes.

What to do when you earn a D or an E?

- Withdraw options
- Course with E grade must be repeated
- Earn higher grades in future courses
- Retake the course and your new grade will replace the old one in your GPA

| C | 2.0 |
| D | 1.0 |
| E | 0.0 |

Repeating a course option

- You can take a course 3 times for grade replacement. A withdrawal ("W" grade) will count as one of the attempts.
- Courses where you received a grade C, D, or E are eligible for grade replacement.
- You can repeat as many courses as you need to repeat, and the highest grade of the 3 attempts will be counted for each course.
- Remember: withdrawing from a course may delay your graduation!

Academic Integrity

What is Plagiarism?

The practice of taking someone else's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own.

Is Plagiarism easy to spot?

YES!

How can I avoid plagiarism?

Don't copy other students' homework or exam answers.

Use citations and give credit to original author.

May I use AI on some of my assignments?

Make sure to check your syllabus with your professor first! They will explain what they consider the appropriate use of AI in that class.

What are the consequences for plagiarism?

Zero grade on assignment or exam You may fail that class Reported to Dean of Students

EXAMPLES OF PLAGIARISM AND CHEATING:

- ▶ Copying somebody else's homework.
- ▶ Getting the answers for a quiz or exam from another person or online.
- ► Submitting a research paper without properly referencing the information.
- ▶ Submitting a paper written by your classmate.
- ► Working on an assignment with another student when the instructor expects you to complete it on your own.
- ▶ Using false facts, changing data to support your arguments or making up information.
- ▶ Submitting a paper written by AI.





WHAT STEPS DO YOU NEED TO TAKE TO BE A SUCCESSFUL DUAL DEGREE STUDENT?

- Study hard to prepare for English proficiency exam.
- ► Passing ENGL 106 on your first attempt is crucial for progressing in your degree.
- ► ENGL 107, 108 and other introductory courses will play a huge role in your GPA do well in all of them!



STEPS TO SUCCESS, CONT.

- Check your WildCat email every day.
- Use a planner to track assignments, tests and due dates.
- Improve your study habits.
- Stay connected with your professors and location manager, especially if you are struggling!
- Attend Student Engagement Events to help you with your study skills, professional development and to practice your English language skills.




