At UA Madrid, hosted by the Institute for American Universities, you can choose from a variety of English taught courses to satisfy your degree requirements, including general education with the approval of your academic advisor. To make choosing courses easier, faculty in the Communication Department preapproved courses to satisfy requirements in your Communication major. The best part is, you'll pay your regular University of Arizona tuition and can use financial aid and scholarships, including **AZ Excellence** and **Wildcat Excellence** awards!

At UA Madrid you can also apply for a Global Internship to gain international work experience. After receiving your internship placement, connect with your academic advisor to discuss how to seek approval for COMM Elective credit. Course availability varies by term and can be subject to change.
